DIRECTOR'S NOTES

WARNING: THIS SHOW CONTAINS NO PLOT! That's probably what makes me love it so much. And what makes it so challenging to stage. Fragments of life are presented with no particular sequential order or logic as the characters examine marriage and commitment from every angle. The themes and observations are more important than the story itself.

When FRC's Artistic Director, Joey Sayer, first asked me to consider directing this wonderful Stephen Sondheim/George Furth musical, I had barely heard of it and knew nothing of its complexity, depth, and brilliance. I was certainly familiar with some of the incredible songs of Stephen Sondheim thanks to Barbara Streisand's Broadway albums, and the DVD recording of Sondheim's "Into The Woods" is one of my favourites. I also knew him to be the brilliant lyricist for "West Side Story" and "Gypsy."

Once I read the script and viewed the tape of the 1996 London version, I was hooked. The Cast recording of the 1996 Broadway Revival has rarely left my CD player and I read numerous books on Sondheim and the making of the show. It quickly became apparent to me that the themes and messages of this show, which was originally produced in 1970, are still relevant today, and so I set the action in the present day.

I knew immediately that the difficulty of the music would require extraordinary performers, so I called upon some tried and true theatre friends to come out for auditions last June. I was also blessed with some incredible (unknown to me) talent to round out our Company, including our fantastic pianist.

It has been an incredible journey, at times frustrating and challenging, but always rewarding. I believe everyone has had their talents stretched in some way and has become better at this craft of ours.

My heartfelt thanks to this great cast for their hard work and commitment: to Kim for her wonderful choreography and advice on song staging, to Greg for putting together the voice-overs and sounds, and to Steve Olson for staging the karate bits.

Thanks to Pasqualina and Angie for keeping the show clicking, to Vickie, Dave, and Erin for giving us such great sound to lay our vocals on, to Bill, Paul, and Ginny for buying into my vision and doing what they do so incredibly well.

And thanks to all of our significant others, whose commitment allows us the time to pursue this crazy hobby of ours, of Being Alive on and around the stage.

ABOUT "COMPANY"

Company, the landmark show about marriage, has music and lyrics written by Stephen Sondheim and book by George Furth. Setting new standards of sophistication and depth for the American musical, Company won the Tony Award for Best Book, Best Music, best Lyrics, as well as the prize for Best Musical. In creating the show, the authors, joined by director Harold Prince and choreographer Michael Bennett, crafted a concept musical in which the style of presentation was vital to the meaning of the show as the story itself.

Company tells the story of a marriage-avoiding thirty-five year old bachelor named Robert and is theatrical collage of his experiences with his married friends and with three women he is dating. A portrait of Robert's empty existence takes shape in a framework of fragmented time. The brilliant Stephen Sondheim songs define Robert's world, functioning as commentaries on the characters and the situations.

Vignettes about each of the couples examine the difficulty of sustaining meaningful emotional relationships in the complex world of contemporary urban America. The couples, which are all acquainted, observe each other's lives, and they wryly comment on each other, much in the manner of a Greek chorus. They form a community connected by the challenge of seeking love and commitment in a landscape where there is little permanence. Robert finally concludes, in spite of the imperfections of each the unions he sees, that life without a significant other is untenable.

As unconventional, complex and challenging work critics described *Company* as "simply in a league by itself," and "the season's best and most refreshingly original musical." Untraditional, inventive and groundbreaking, *Company* proved to be a major turning point in the evolution of the American musical.
